

### Q: Where are MassCommute TMAs?

In 2015, there are 12 TMAs serving over 300 members in 40 municipalities across the Commonwealth



### Q: How did MassCommute get started?

Initially formed in 2001 as "The TMA Council of Massachusetts", MassCommute was organized via MOU between 11 TMAs who had been meeting as an informal "TMA Roundtable" since the 1990s. MassCommute received legal status as a 501c4 organization in 2005.

#### **Goals:**

- ✓ Ensure continued funding for TMAs & for the TMA Council to promote & support TMAs
- ✓ **Develop & maintain positive working relationship with state** commuter options program (then CARAVAN, now MassRIDES) while distinguishing how TMAs are different.

#### **Focus on Advocacy:**

2003: "Day on the Hill" campaign promotes TMAs and seeks direct funding for them

**2004:** Series of meetings with state & federal offices, state legislators, and Congressional reps provides information about MassCommute mission and the value of TMAs

**2005:** MassCommute publishes first "FastStats Report" highlighting cumulative impacts TMAs have had on reduced VMT, ghgs, employer and commuter expenditures, etc

**2006:** Meetings with FTA to push for CMAQ funding for TMAs (ie. "TMAs can double the funding through private sector matches!")

**2008-2009**: Meetings with EOT (now MassDOT) result in MOU to implement a work plan and funding to MassCommute TMAs



### **Sharing TMA Impacts**

#### TMAs: A Smart Return on Investment



Since 2009, MassCommute TMAs have received a combination of public (MassDOT) and private (membership dues) funds.

Government support has triggered even more private sector investment in transportation, yielding continually growing public benefits.

\$2,900,000 in public funding has been leveraged into \$75,850,826 in private sector investment since 2009.



## **Preserving State Funding for TMAs:**MassCommute Partnership with MassDOT

- ❖ December 2014: Expiration of 5 year MassCommute MOU with MassDOT (\$50,000/year/TMA via CMAQ)
- Winter/Spring 2015: Creation of new marketing materials, meetings with legislators, legislation filed, commissioning TMA white paper
- June 2015: Notification of non-eligibility for continued CMAQ funding (for operations)
- ❖ July 2015: Meeting with Sec.Pollack/DOT, collaboration with ACT to research opportunities for continued CMAQ funding & reach out to FHWA and federal delegation
- August 2015: Notification of approved CMAQ funding for 11 established TMAs (via CMAQ Education & Outreach) & 4 newly established TMAs (via CMAQ Operations)



### **TMA White Paper 2015**


In early 2015, MassCommute retained consultants at Eastern Research Group (ERG) to prepare a research paper addressing:

- ✓ How are TMAs defined? Exploring definitions
- ✓ What do TMAs do? Exploring roles & programs
- ✓ How are TMAs modeled? Exploring:
  - ✓ Funding mechanisms
  - ✓ Relationships with state governments, municipalities, community groups & businesses
- ✓ What policies, legislation, & goals exist to support TDM? Exploring how TMAs can most effectively & cost efficiently deliver solutions
- ✓ What benefits are MA TMAs yielding and how can they
  be even more effective?

# TMA White Paper 2015: What We Found

#### Massachusetts' TMAs:

- ✓ Are uniquely collaborative
  - **✓** MassCommute
  - ✓ Customized member services



- ✓ Three tiers of effective TDM → Synergy!
  - 1. State & Regional TDM Programs (like MassRIDES)
  - 2. Local TDM Programs (like TMAs)
  - 3. Employer TDM Programs
- **✓** Support state climate and transportation initiatives



### TMAs Deliver Benefits to MA

- ✓ Reduce Fuel Use and CO₂ Emissions
  - ✓ In 2013, TMAs helped reduce vehicle trips by 1.3 million, which reduced CO₂ emissions by nearly 4,700 tons
- ✓ Mitigate Traffic Congestion
- ✓ Encourage Biking and Walking
  - ✓ Workout to Work, Bicycle Challenge, education and advocacy
- ✓ Drive Demand for Public Transit and Raise its Impact
- ✓ Leverage TDM Funds and Reduce Trans. Expenditures
  - ✓ Private investment accounts for up to 95% of TMAs' budget
- ✓ Develop and Enact Transportation Policies and Plans
